### 6. CHAIR & VICE CHAIR STATEMENT ON BEHALF OF THE BOARD

As Chair and Vice Chair of The Russell School Governing Board, we are delighted to share the annual governance statement with you. Thank you to the wonderful students, staff, parents/carers and governors of The Russell School for all that they do make our school a special and safe place to learn and thrive. With thanks to our Head, Laura Brooks, who has an unrelenting focus on standards.

As a Governing Body, our responsibility as stated by Department of Education guidance requires our Board to be strategic and focus on core functions including setting the vision and strategic direction of school, holding the head teacher to account for educational performance and ensuring financial resources are well spent. These principles are at the heart of what our Governors do.

Our School Improvement Committee has this year dedicated time to strategic review of educational outcomes and attainment, with a particular focus on attendance, attainment, the support and progress of children with SEND/PPG, the effectiveness of spending on Sports Premium, and of course safeguarding. Our Link Governor for Safeguarding has undertaken thorough reviews of safeguarding at the Russell. We remain vigilant.

Whilst the financial landscape remains challenging, the Russell has set a balanced budget and we remain committed to increasing income for our school through effective usage of the fantastic space and donations/grants. We are considered with our budgets, whilst focusing on the priorities as set out in our School Development Plan and ensuring that children that live locally choose the Russell. The future financial landscape remains challenging, and there is more work to do to address the ongoing challenges because of funding and falling roll pressures.

Our Resources Committee has focused on high quality financial oversight, income generation and ensuring the effective use of resources. We welcomed external challenge on our effectiveness and rigour with regards to our financial management and governance and were pleased to see the findings demonstrated strong governance at the Russell.

Our school continues to drive up standards of educational outcomes with an unrelenting focus on meeting and exceeding Richmond and National Averages. We are particularly pleased to see strong results across Phonics, Year 4 Multiplication Check and Year 6 SATs.

We were supported both externally and by our governing board to bring challenge and rigour. Our Linked Governors (responsible for key areas of school life) visited the school to provide strategic challenge and the SLT met with Governors regularly on key issues. We welcomed advisors from Achieving for Children (AfC) on attendance, safeguarding, writing and more. Our School Improvement Partner met with our Head termly to share reflections which were shared and discussed with the governing Board. At Board we reviewed the SDP to ensure that priorities agreed at the start of the year had progressed for the benefit of the children and staff at the Russell.

We thank the PTA for their support this year in running excellent events and working with Governors to streamline donations so that we can maximise our income at a time of budgetary pressure.

In governance, we sought to focus on strengthening the processes of the governing board, to recruit further governors to bring in wider skills and develop training, included in this report. We remain committed to exemplary governance and have ambitious plans for September to further bring challenge, support and rigour to governance at the Russell.
