Nursery

It has been a busy half term as we welcomed new children into the class. This half term our topic has been all about travelling to different places. We have read the books 'The Big Blue Train' and 'The Big Yellow Digger'. We have made trains using collage materials and talked about who might be on the train and where they are going. We have explored the shapes and language of 'circles' and cutting round shapes. In Mental Health Week we have been exploring our feelings and making 'happy faces' with our resources. We have also been learning new letter sounds each week, exploring the sounds they can hear at the start of words and practising saying the sounds correctly.



Reception

Reception have had many 'Fantastic Adventures' this half term! We've climbed giant beanstalks, swum underwater with mermaids and journeyed through deep dark woods, exploring some well-known traditional tales. We learned so much about story structure and main characters, and also explored alternative versions, understanding that the possibilities are endless when it comes to storytelling! We also fully embraced Children's Mental Health Week through daily circle times and have a better understanding of what a growth mindset is, accepting that making mistakes is all part of learning. We can't wait till our next topic Amazing Animals! We will be talking about what living beings need to survive and exploring how animals have adapted in different climates. I hope you all have a wonderful half term and I look forward to hearing all about your adventures when we come back! Miss Dittrich


Year 2
