
I hope you all enjoy a restful weekend and I look forward to seeing everyone next week – our final week of the half term.

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Reading Hut Reveal!










A wonderful afternoon hearing from Peter Bunzl, celebrating the joy of reading in our fantastic reading hut!




Year 4

Year 6


Year Six have had lots of highs and lows!
