Some musical highlights



Nursery



Look What We Have Been Learning ...

Year 3 and 4...

This past fortnight in Nightingale Class has been a busy one. We have been busy writing our own retelling of the first chapter of *Stig of the Dump*, focusing on using fronted adverbials, expanded noun phrases and direct speech. In Maths we have been learning and practicing our 4- and 8-times tables and some of the corresponding division facts to go with them. In History we have been becoming archaeologists, looking at artefacts from the Stone Age and thinking about what they may have been used for and what they may have been made of. Well done - a fantastic week Year 3!

Hello from Jenner Class! This week Year 4 have been continuing to develop their stories in English. We have been focusing on senses, thoughts and feelings to help deepen their stories. We have been using some adventurous and dramatic vocabulary inspired by our new topic, Potions. We have gathered our vocabulary through play scripts (Macbeth), stories (Alice in Wonderland) and our guided reading book (George's Marvellous Medicine). We have also been looking at depth in art, whereby we have been using different materials and have focused on enlarging a section of the image. This has helped us to develop our skills in size, shadows, fading etc.

Look What We Have Been Learning This Week... Year 5 and 6....

Year 5 have started the new term with the wonderful Ancient Egyptians topic. We have been locating Egypt on a world map and creating an enormous timeline dating back to the early civilizations! We have been finding out about their beliefs in different Gods and about the afterlife, coupled with the all-important mummification process! Our independent research has helped, in preparation for our class assembly next week, and we look forward to sharing this with you.

On Tuesday, Year 6 had an immersive day of costumes, baking and art to kick-start their WWII topic. All children entered into the spirit and took to their roles with gusto!
