Look What We Have Been Learning This Week... Nursery and Reception

We have now managed 6 weeks in our Nursery and are definitely ready for a rest! The children have already made so much progress in their confidence and independence. They are following the routines and enjoying using our visual timetable to work out which activities are coming up each day and which have been completed.

This week we have been listening to the story 'Walking through the Jungle' and thinking about all sorts of animals we might see. We have played with them in our small world area and also talked about which countries they may come from using our world map puzzle. This week we have also talked about animals that come out at night and have learned the word 'nocturnal'.

As our jungle is full of monkeys that like bananas, we have chosen to make banana muffins in our cooking. Finally we have listened to the story 'Hands are not for Hitting' and talked about all the useful and kind things we can do with our hands.

Down in Nakate Class we can't quite believe it's already half term; what a time we've had! We are all feeling settled into our new routine and have been enjoying starting phonics and number time and sharing in learning that inspires us as we move around the classroom. This week, Miss Lee shared *The Tiger Who Came to Tea* it's a classic and we have loved it. We have read the story lots and we are beginning to learn words from it by reading it together, we have written shopping lists and made food using our new phonic and number skills and have been developing our fine motor by feeding tigers - watch out for those teeth! We looked at animal patterns and voted on whether we would want tigers to come and visit us. But now it is time for a rest!

Year 1 and 2

As part of our *School Days* project, we have been creating a non-fiction report about our school day. As part of this, we were excited to show Miss Dittrich our favourite games to play during the school day, which included playing tennis, building and drawing.





Bolt class have thrown themselves into all things pirate! We were very excited to find a pirate's treasure chest full of interesting things to explore and write about, including a skull and a huge diamond!

We have really enjoyed talking about the jobs pirates might have had on-board ships and playing the roles of captains and crew. There's been some amazing map-making and writing instructions to follow a trail on the treasure map to get to X marks the spot. The class are now beginning to plan their pirate adventures using all their skills in constructing sentences, using punctuation and interesting topic words.

The children are keeping very active with a great running PE lesson every week, challenging themselves with improving their running form; the children are all aspiring Usain Bolts!

Year 3 and 4

What a fantastic first half term we have had in Year 3! On Wednesday, as part of our *Predators* project, we had a school trip to London Zoo where we got to see some of the world's biggest land predators - including lions and tigers - up close. In English this half term we have been busy writing setting descriptions and stories and creating informative leaflets about our favourite predators. In maths, we are partway through our numbers to 1000 unit, putting us in a great position to continue after half term.



Hello from Jenner Class! This week we finished writing our play scripts which included writing character and setting descriptions, as well as stage directions and dialogue. As our first half term comes to an end our topic of Invasion ends too and we have completed our weaving pieces. The children used a mixture of colours and weaving techniques to create their loom. We have been working on place value this half term and will continue to deepen our learning further next term as we explore more problem solving place value questions.

Have a lovely and well rested half term and I am excited to start our new topic in Jenner class which is *Burps, Bottoms and Bile....*

Year 5 and 6

How did it get to be the end of the half term already?! Malala class have taken year 6 in their stride and have really impressed Mrs McCann and Miss James with their focus and drive for success in all areas so far. This week we have been putting a lot of effort into trying to convey all of the learning we have done this half term about our ID project into a class assembly - no easy task! We do hope all of the family members who came this morning really enjoyed learning about our learning. In English over the past couple of weeks, we have been writing poetry based on this year's Black History Month theme: 'Salute to our Sisters' and we finished our non-chronological reporting about how amazing finger prints are. In maths we have really been refining our place value knowledge so that we are in the best place possible to move on next half term. We are looking forward to getting stuck into our next projects after the break.



Suddenly, the end of the first half term is over! Year 5 are looking forward to returning for our new topic *Earth and Space!* During our Pestilence topic, the children have worked very hard and have produced some lovely writing, including retelling the story of the Peasants' Revolt, writing their own adventure story and making their own application to Knight school! In maths, we have been calculating with decimals to 2dp – during half term, see if you can get your child to add up your shopping bill accurately! In science, we have watched our microbes grow in the petri dishes and were surprised by the amount they have multiplied! It was lovely to meet you all at parents and carers' evening to talk about your children's start to Year 5. I hope you all have a restful half term and look forward to the very busy Christmas build up!




