Reception

In Reception, we celebrated Lunar New Year! As it is the year of the snake, we had lots of snake related activities in the classroom, watched the special lion and dragon dances and read lots of books about the festival, including The Magic Paintbrush, a Chinese folk tale about a paintbrush with magical powers! We thought about what we might like to paint that would help others in the hope that it becomes real, just like in the story. Examples include umbrellas so we could stay out in the rain all day, a bench for people who can't walk and a unicorn for people who want to fly! How kind Reception.

Year 1

Year 1 have been working hard and using all of their phonics knowledge to write instructions for how to make a potion for a magic hat! They have also been working hard on their grammar. They been changing questions into commands. It's tricker than you think!

Year 2

This week in year 2 we have been writing biographies all about David Attenborough's life. In Maths we have enjoyed exploring 2D and 3D shapes and learned some new mathematical language. Another highlight was learning about how exercise is good for our bodies in Science and recorded our heart beats!

Year 3

Year 3 have been working hard on column addition and subtraction. They have been solving problems with missing numbers. They have also been researching Egyptian foods – all ready for their DT project!

Year 4

Over the last two weeks, year 4 have been very productive! They completed their published newspaper articles in their orange books all about The Tunnel by Anthony Browne. The children have really engaged with the book, and made some very interesting predictions informed by the imagery in the book. In maths, we have been using our knowledge of multiplication to apply the distributive law when multiplying unknown equations. Well done Year 4, keep up the hard work!

Year 5

These last couple of weeks in Year 5, we have been thinking about our school values and trying hard to work together. We have been finding ways to encourage each other and ways to show random acts of kindness. In English, we have been thinking about the use of determiners in our sentences and recognising and using 'Modal Verbs' and 'Adverbs of Possibility' to write about things that might happen in the future, whilst thinking about our own hopes and goals as we begin 2025. We have been learning about other cultures and the celebrations surrounding the Lunar New Year

In maths, we continue to use our times table knowledge to solve division calculations, using the bus stop method. Finally, the highlight of the last couple of weeks was our visit to the British Museum. Thank you again to all our parent volunteers for your support on the day – it was very much appreciated.



Year 6

Fanshawe class have been very busy this fortnight, particularly in English. The children have been exploring the picture book, *Rose Blanche*, with powerful illustrations depicting life during WWII. The children have finished their own narratives inspired by the book, using figurative and emotive language. Continuing with their knowledge of WWII, the children have started to build their Anderson Shelters, based on their own designs. In maths, the children continue to deepen their understanding of fractions as we move to multiplication of fractions. Finally, Year 6's football teams performed brilliantly during their girls' and boys' matches with Deer Park School.
