
## **Nursery**

We have been trying to recognise these shapes around us. In phonics we have enjoyed finding things in the nursery that begin with 'l' for 'lollipop'. We have also practiced saying the sound correctly. Some of our beans that we planted before the holiday have started growing at home. Erin sent us a photo of her bean! I wonder how tall it will grow?



## Reception

This week, Reception had their first P.E lesson! We talked about how each of us belong to a house and that is what the colour of our t-shirts represent. Many children thought P.E was just about running, but we explored it further and saw pictures of children balancing, using equipment carefully, playing in teams and learning new skills. We started off the session with a warm up, then played the colours game and ended with a cool down. Children especially enjoyed walking around the hall doing the heel-to-toe walk, what great focus! We can't wait till next week!





#### Year 1

The children have had great fun immersing themselves into our new topic 'Weather'. In English, we are reading the text 'Ivy and the Lonely Raincloud' and we are preparing to write an information text all about the different seasons. In maths, we have been looking at different dates and have begun developing an understanding of time. The children are very excited because next week we will start exploring time with the clocks! This week we have also been revising all of our phonics sounds and preparing for the phonics screening next week. It has absolutely lovely to see all of the children developing a love for reading and reading regularly at home. Thank you for your support with this, it makes all the difference.

#### Year 2

Our week has been rather different this week with Mrs McCann being away on the Year 6 trip. This week we have completed some assessments in English and maths which has given us all a great sense of achievement! We have also had real fun reading a hilarious book called *The 13-Story Treehouse*. We went on a fun adventure with the main characters, Terry and Andy. We are very much looking forward to reading the next book next week!

#### Year 3

I hope everyone had a restful break over half term. It was wonderful to see the children come back in so well rested and ready to learn. In English this week, we have started looking at a new book called 'Elf Road'. We have been creating our own story and describing the food we would like to have in our dream feast. In maths, we have started learning about time and I have been so impressed with how the children have handled this concept. Our new science topic this term is 'Light' and we have started by looking at different sources of light and what darkness is.

#### Year 4

We have had a wonderful week back in Year 4! The children have made a fantastic start to their multiplication tables checks, as well as starting our new maths topic, symmetry. In English, we have begun to explore the book Flotsam, and the children really enjoyed exploring its beautiful illustrations and identifying themes. In PE, we have been exploring personal achievement, and will continue to build upon our resilience in preparation for sports day. Thank you for your hard work this week Year 4!

#### Year 5


Another busy start to our last term in Year 5! We have begun our new science topic by testing the law of forces, in particular centripetal forces. We have been writing our calligram poems about a roller-coaster using metaphors, similes and personification to excite the reader. In maths, we are learning about converting units of measure and using our reasoning and problem solving skills. Finally, we have set ourselves some targets for the end of Year 5 for school, home and clubs...hopefully you'll see a difference!


