
## Nursery

The Nursery have been reading books about growing. We have been thinking about what plants need to help them grow and talking about the parts of a plant- roots, stem and leaves. We have read 'The Tiny Seed' and we planted cress which is starting to grow! This week we have been reading 'Jack and the Beanstalk' and have planted our own 'magic beans'. I wonder if they will grow into beanstalks? We have made a beanstalk in our classroom and Jack has climbed to the top!



### Reception

Reception have enjoyed learning about things that move! In previous weeks, we have focussed on boats and aeroplanes, and this week it is buses. We all talked about the bus journeys we take and where we have been on buses. We absolutely loved our book of the week, **The Hundred Decker Bus by Mike Smith**, and have used our imagination to draw our own buses with multiple decks. We then applied our phonics to write sentences about them. We have also been busy designing our own vehicles. We first decided if we wanted our vehicle to go in the air, water or on a road. We then drew our design, labelling key parts and then made vehicles, following our plans carefully. Next week we will present our work to our friends and think about if we want to make any changes.





It has been an exciting couple of weeks in Year 1 with a trip to the farm! We went on a tractor ride, fed the animals, saw newborn animals and even watched a pig race! In class, we have also been busy writing an advert for our 'perfect pet,' inspired by the book 'WANTED: The Perfect Pet'. We had lots of fun exploring what might make a perfect pet. In maths we have been busy exploring numbers to 100 and have been using practical methods to support place value number knowledge. In geography, we have been exploring world maps, continents and oceans.



It's been another busy and exciting two weeks in Year 2!

We had a wonderful trip to the Sea Life Centre. The children were full of curiosity and loved seeing sea creatures up close. Back in the classroom, the children have been busy publishing their own stories, and we're so proud of their fantastic writing! Look out for these coming home.

In science, we have explored local habitats by heading outside for an invertebrate investigation and the children also created amazing habitat shoeboxes – such imagination and effort on display! In maths, we've been learning more about fractions, including three quarters and recognising that two quarters is the same as one half, great progress all round. In history, we've been comparing seaside holidays from the past and present. What do you think would have been more fun: donkey rides and deckchairs or arcades and ice cream? Finally, there's a real buzz in the air as we start getting ready for our upcoming "Seaside /Beach Afternoon", details to come soon!





What a lovely fortnight it has been. We have enjoyed a fantastic trip to Gunnersbury Park Museum to take part in a fantastic workshop, learning all about the Romans. We have continued our book in English - *Escape from Pompeii*, and have been thinking about how the people of Pompeii felt when Mount Vesuvius erupted. In art we have been sketching some of the cast bodies discovered so many years after the eruption. Well done for another fantastic week Year 3.



Year 4 have had a fantastic couple of weeks since the bank holiday! The children have continued to work very hard in preparation for our upcoming multiplication tables check, on top of learning all about mixed numbers and improper fractions in maths. In English, we have begun to look at a variety of fairy tales and their features, and the children are very excited to write their own! This will tie in nicely with our DT project, where we will use paper mechanisms to create an interactive story book. Well done for all your hard work this week Year 4!


# Year 5


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
