Dear Families,

I can't believe another term is complete and the final term of the academic year is nearly upon us!

Highlights across the school this term include: class assemblies, music events, parent / carer meetings, numerous sports fixtures, performing at the O2, performing at The Rose Theatre, exploring the local area, trips to museums and theatres, our on-site history project and orchard planting, preparing the allotment area and last but not least, today's eggciting raffle!

We are saying goodbye to Miss Mulchrone as she moves on to start her next phase of life in Devon. I know you will all join us in thanking her for the love and care she has shown the children in her class and the commitment and support she has shown the team.

After the Spring break, many of our children (and teachers) will be gearing themselves up towards national benchmarking tests. These tests are completed by all children across England.

Our Year 1s will be completing their phonics screening check in June. Miss Dittrich will be inviting families into the classroom on Monday 28<sup>th</sup> April at 3.30pm to explain the process and answer any questions.

Although the Year 2 SATS tests are no longer a mandatory assessment point, all local authority schools will be given SATS-type material to use with the children at some point in May. Teachers will share the material in class as part of their everyday lessons and children won't be placed under any unnecessary stress or strain.

Year 4 will take part in the multiplication check in June. Get on Times Tables Rock Stars to challenge yourselves, beat your previous scores and limber up for the June check!

Our Year 6 children will take their national SATS assessments w/c 12<sup>th</sup> May. Teachers are working hard to prepare the children and ensure they feel calm and confident. Please support your children by ensuing they complete any homework activities and encouraging them to read widely and often!

Just a reminder that we have *Camp Beaumont* providing clubs throughout the Spring break. Please do use this service or we will lose it!

As children will have a well-deserved break over the next couple of weeks, please can I urge you all to be mindful of how much screen time the children will be accessing? Below, I have attached some QR codes which give clear guidance on how to set up restrictions on apps and devices. We have had a number of cases of having to intervene in playground games which have been influenced by highly inappropriate material accessed online.

As ever, I want to thank you all for supporting your children and supporting us all. We really are operating in very challenging economical times in schools and the support, engagement, time and expertise which you all as a community offer us are so appreciated.

For many of our families there will be cause for celebrations over the break whether that be over the Easter weekend or during Passover – and we hope any of our families who celebrated Eid last weekend had a wonderful time with family and friends. I wish you all a restful and enjoyable time,
